



Ontario Trillium Benefit
Helps people in the North pay for energy costs, and provides relief for sales tax on energy and property tax.

Healthy Homes Renovation Tax Credit
65 or older? Live with a senior relative? You can get up to \$1,500 to help with the cost of making your home accessible.



Children's Activity Tax Credit - If you have children, you can get up to \$54.10 per child for activities like painting, hockey and music lessons.
Ontario Child Benefit - Helps low-income families with up to \$1,336 for each child under 18.



Ontario Senior Homeowners' Property Tax Grant
64 or older on Dec. 31, 2014 and own your home? You can get up to \$500 to help with property taxes.

Are you getting money back?
File your tax return to find out



Am I eligible?

File your tax return to find out. Even if you receive social assistance or didn't earn income, filing a tax return could help you get money back.



How much will I get?

It depends on the tax credit or benefit you claim and your specific situation – how much money you make, how old you are and other factors.



You could get money back

File before April 30 to get your benefits on time

A single young adult from Hamilton earning \$22,000 paid \$820/month in rent – **could get back \$760**



A single parent in Timmins with one child and an income of \$27,000 paid \$800/month rent and \$400 for art lessons – **could get back \$2,111**



A senior couple from Kitchener with a combined income of \$28,000 paid \$2,700 in property tax and \$3,200 for wheel chair ramps – **could get back \$2,497**



A family of four from Ottawa with two kids and a combined income of \$29,500 paid \$2,500 in property tax and \$400 for music lessons – **could get back \$3,542**
